UNIFORM POLICY – DRESS CODE

Rationale

At Glenroy Private our uniform is a sign of our community. It reflects the school vision statement and goals. All families sign as part of the confirmation of enrolment, a consent form supporting the uniform and grooming requirements of our school.

Students wear a uniform:

- To develop a sense of student unity, pride and loyalty to our school and to its vision.
- To de-emphasise differences in appearance.
- To focus on the real purpose of schooling i.e. the development of an individuality of intellect, imagination and personality.

Aim

The wearing of the school uniform promotes pride in our school and self. Not only when at school but also when on excursions, sporting and cultural events. Glenroy Private strongly supports the wearing of a school uniform and it is an expectation that all students are correctly attired at all times. If the student does not follow the school policy he/she will not be allowed to represent the school, participate in non-assessable excursions, leave the ground on a school activity or attend school social functions.

Procedures

It is the responsibility of all parents to ensure that students are attired in correct, well fitting, complete school uniform. Uniforms must be in good condition and repair. Current uniform is to be worn therefore during school hours, and to and from school.

Staff members conduct a daily check of uniform standards. A uniform note will be sent home should there be any digression from the school's dress code. The note should be returned to school the following day with a parent's signature. If the student is found out of uniform a second time parents will be contacted by the school. The third time parents will be contacted by the school to take the student home to change or to bring the appropriate uniform to school.

If some accident or difficulty prevents students from wearing full uniform on any particular day, parents are required to send a note of explanation to the child's class teacher.

Students are required to attend school in full school uniform every day. Sports uniform can only be worn on sports day.

School Uniform

The correct uniform, which is compulsory, is as follows:

Boys F-6

- Glenroy Private grey pants, blue short sleeve/long sleeve shirt.
- Black leather school shoes and grey socks.

Boys 7-10

- Glenroy Private grey pants, blue short sleeve and tie.
- Black school shoes and grey socks.

Boys 11-12

- Glenroy Private navy pants, white short sleeve shirt and tie.
- Black school shoes and grey socks.

Girls F-6

- Glenroy Private check tunic, blue long sleeve shirt and white (2 piece) Hijab.
- Black school shoes and navy socks.

Girls 7-10

- Glenroy Private check skirt, blue long sleeve shirt, vest and white (2 piece) Hijab.
- Black school shoes and navy socks.

Girls 11-12

- Glenroy Private navy skirt and blazer, white long sleeve shirt, and white or navy (1 piece) Hijab.
- Black school shoes and navy socks.

Note: Unisex school navy jumper can be worn under blazers in cold winter weather

Sport Uniform

Boys and girls are to wear unisex school navy blue track suit, blue polo shirt and black sport shoes (Joggers). Sport uniform shall only be worn on sport days.

Sun Hats / Beanies

The Children must wear their school uniform hat throughout the year. The school has a "No Hat – No Play" policy. In particularly wintry conditions, hats may be dispensed with at the discretion of the principal and the school beanie may be worn. Slouch hats are worn in Term 1 and 4, and during all outdoor sport sessions both in summer and winter. School beanies, scarves and gloves are an option to be worn in Terms 2 and 3 only.

Uniform Purchasing

For parents wishing to purchase the school uniform they may do so only on **Wednesday between 10am and 12:30 pm.**

NB: All uniform items must be **clearly marked** with the name of the child. These labels should be checked regularly.

Lost Property

No responsibility is taken by the school for lost articles. Parents are most welcome to check for lost items in the lost property collection. We make every effort to have lost items claimed but unmarked, unclaimed items left at the end of each school year will be sold as second hand garments.

All lost property is housed in boxes in the front office area.
